

# The Prettiest Town: Beyond the Bricks and Mortar

I am going to begin the update by doing what Canadians do best: apologize. We are sorry.

But what for? Well, we recently opened our latest exhibit, The Prettiest Town: Beyond the Bricks and Mortar, which explores just a sprinkle...nay, a dash of the HUNDREDS of heritage homes in NOTL. Sarah and I wished we could have featured many more. Trust us, it was hard to narrow down the list.

So, we may have had to leave your beautiful heritage home out of the exhibition, and so, we apologize for that.

We chose to present this exhibit for several reasons. These heritage buildings give our town its charm and are one of the reasons we are continuously ranked as one of the most beautiful places in Canada. Just like the wineries, arts, culture, and tender fruit industries, the "pretty homes" and "charming streets" have become the foundation of our tourism economy. So, we wanted to explore some of the homes that contribute to our vibrant community.

But we also wanted to draw attention to the fact that hundreds of heritage buildings are now under threat due to Bill 23 (More Homes Built Faster Act). What many people don't know is that this act threatens our built heritage. The heritage sections of the act have been overshadowed by other aspects of the bill, including the province's amendments to the Green Belt, which have since been reversed.

In terms of heritage, Bill 23 requires that all properties with a heritage value listed on the municipal register (but not designated), must be designated by 2025 or they will be removed and unprotected for at least five years. This means that these buildings can be demolished and drastically altered with little recourse. Not all the buildings featured in this exhibition are designated or located within the Heritage District.

Built heritage is not a renewable resource. Therefore, we can potentially lose heritage buildings like the Clench House or the Kerr-Wool House, which are not designated. In this way, the histories contained within their walls would also be lost.
