Cut out the large square. Fold in half and then half again.

Unfold and flip face down.

Fold in each corner to meet in the middle. Do not overlap the four points

Flip over and fold each corner into the middle again.

Fold in half and poke your thumbs and forefingers under each flap

Bring your fingers together to form a peak and you're done!
